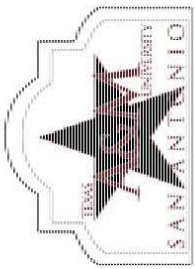

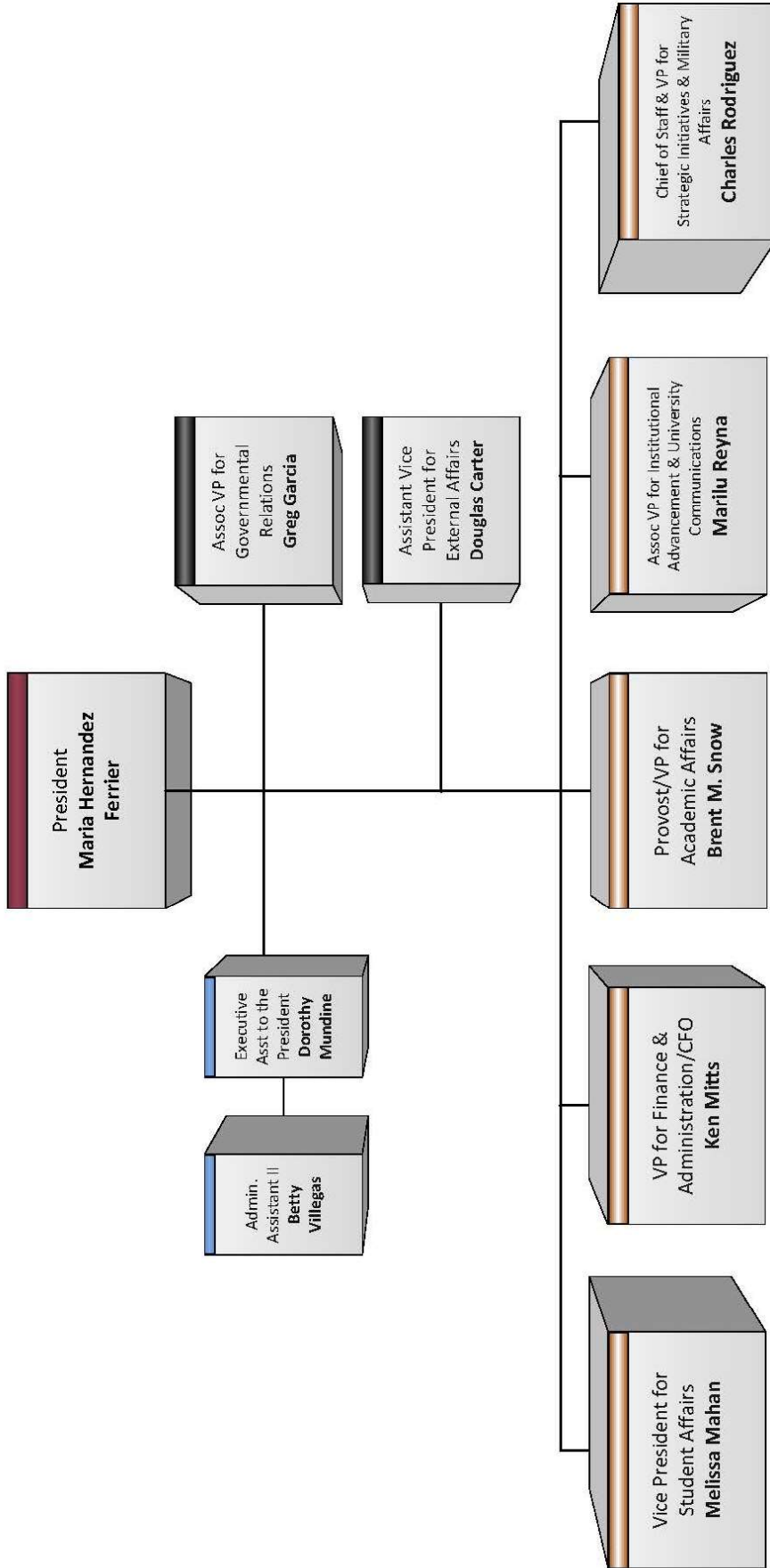

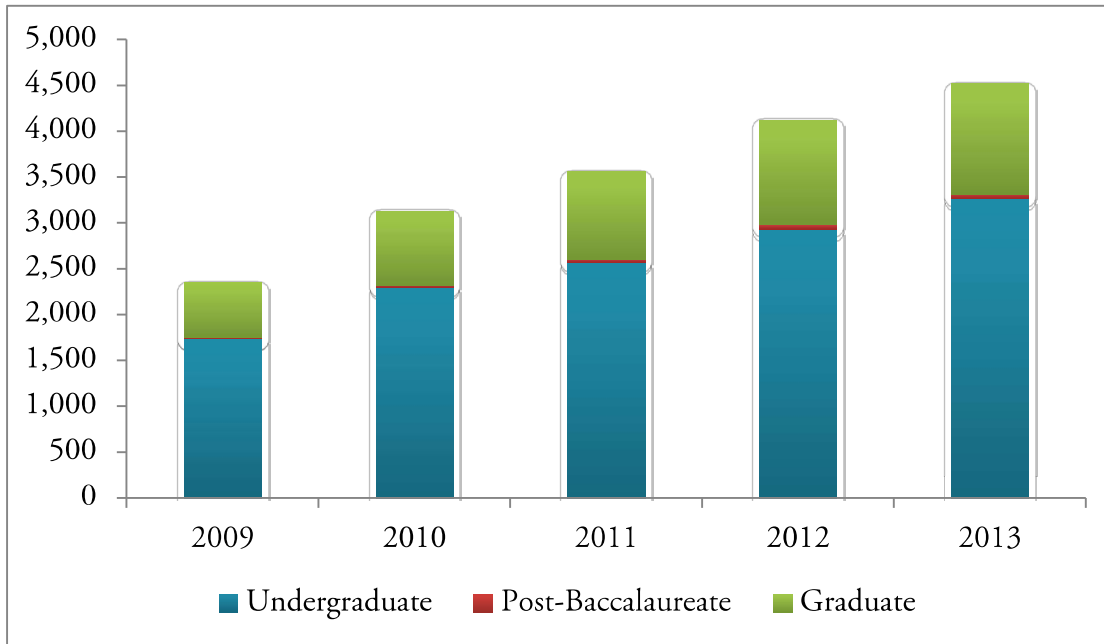

### Annual Unduplicated Enrollment<sup>6</sup>

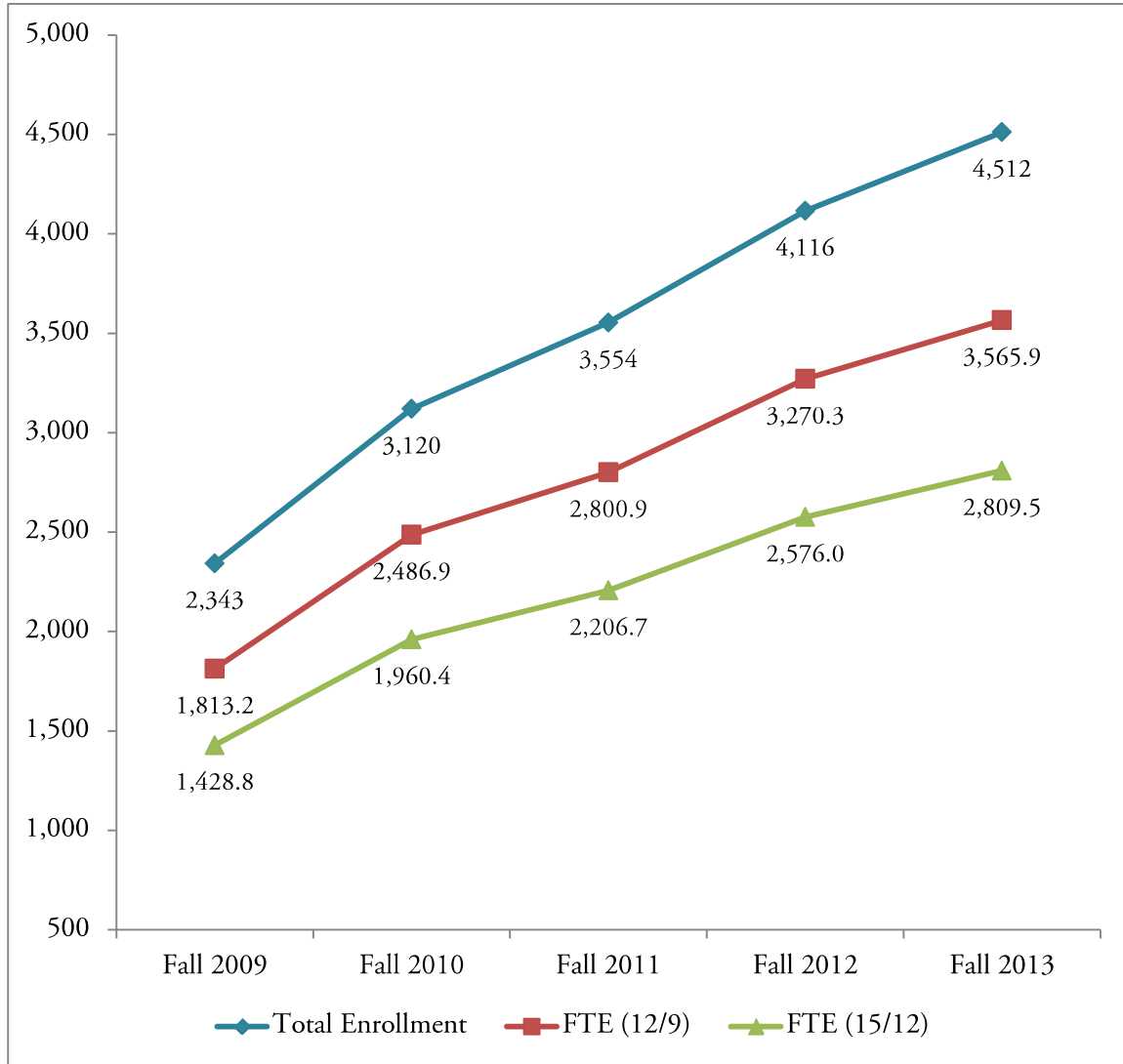

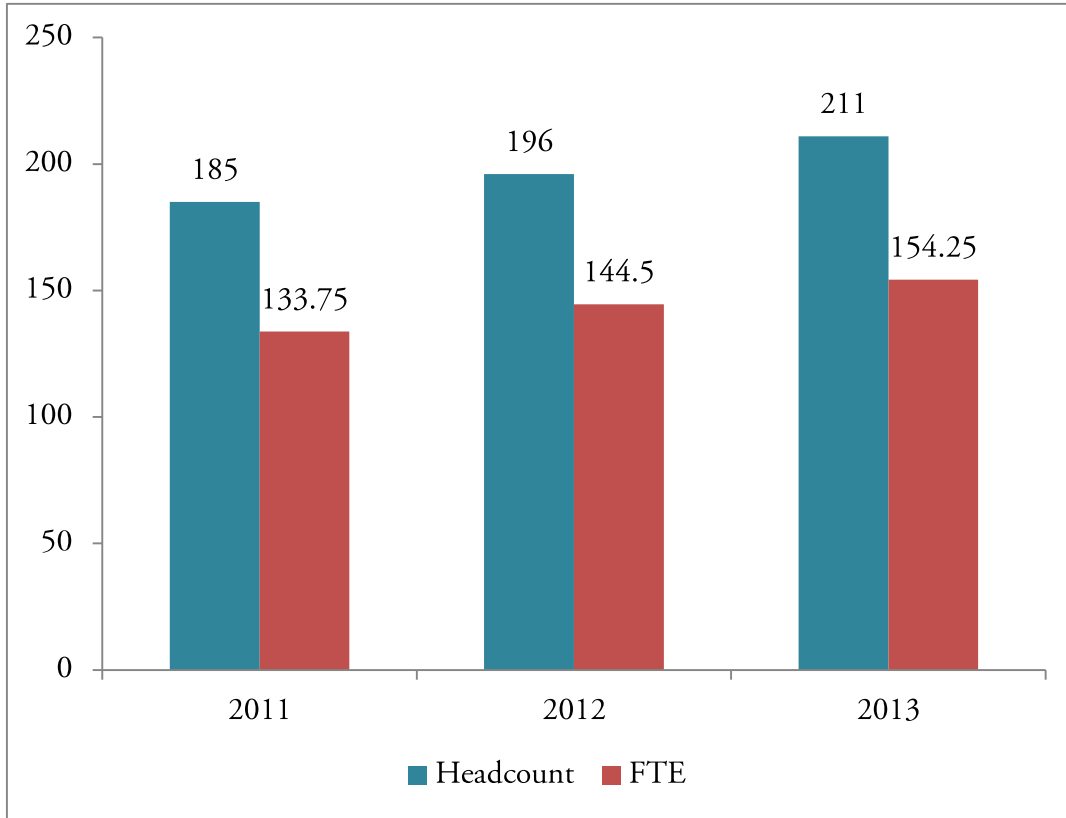

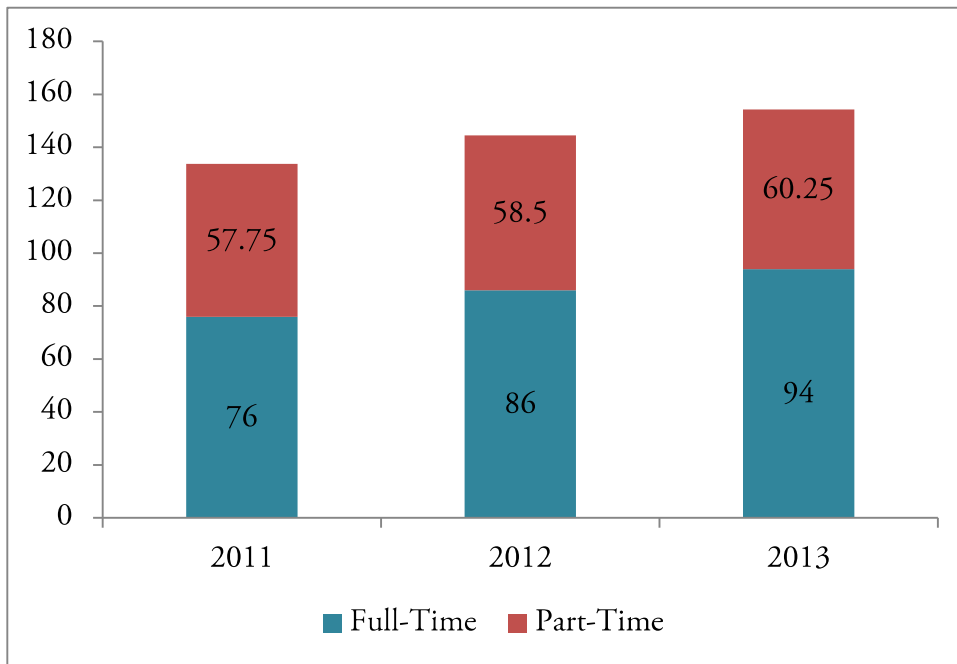

**TAMU-SA Faculty Fall 2011 - 2013<sup>22</sup>**

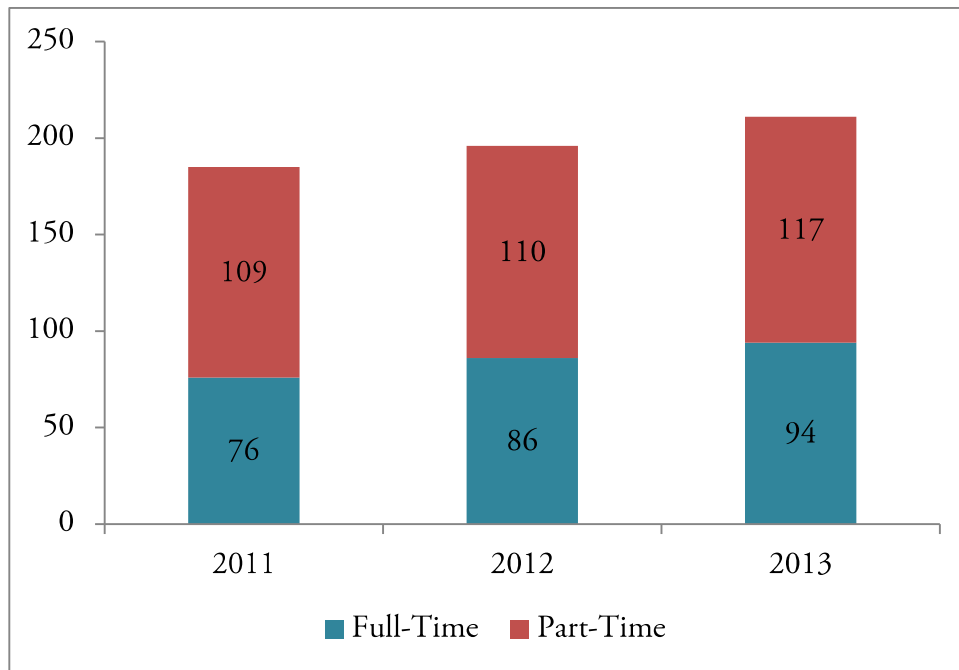


**Faculty FTE (Full-Time Equivalent) Fall 2011 - 2013<sup>22</sup>**

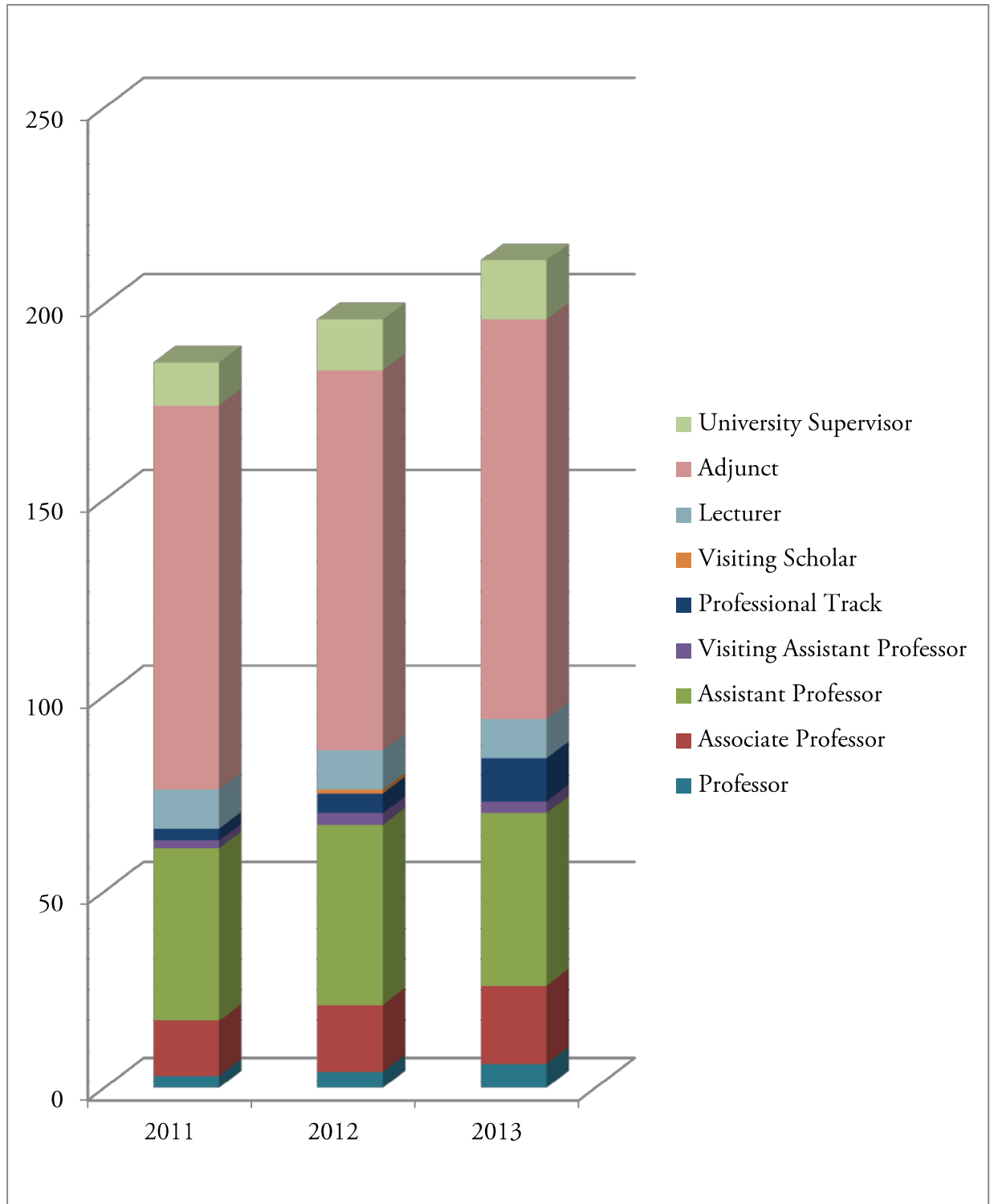
