This internship will require students to perform administrative work with the justice of the peace dealing with traffic cases, civil claims up to \$20,000 (including evictions and debt collection, neighbor disputes), and truancy.

You can intern with any judge in the Bexar County Courthouse. Just send an email with your information including your name, your resume, and that you are a TAMUSA student to the court coordinator for the court that you are interested in.
