

Subdomain Guidelines

Overview

A subdomain is a child of the main TAMUSA domain, used to differentiate **major areas** such as University-wide resources, applications, research centers or initiatives of the university.

Most administrative sites will fall into directories under tamusa.edu, for example tamusa.edu/admissions. This hierarchy allows site visitors to differentiate between types of TAMUSA departments and allows for ITS groups to establish and organize website across different servers and platforms.

Consistent URLs improve site trust, and they also assist SEO efforts and improve the ability to track users between properties using analytics.

Several Guidelines are used in the creation of subdomains. These guidelines are intended to ensure that subdomains are created in a controlled manner, and effectively used once they are created.

Guidelines

- 1. Created subdomain will follow categorical naming convention and must be one of the following a **word**, **abbreviation**, or **acronym**. For example:
 - a. Software Services might use service.tamusa.edu
 - b. Organization Initiatives might use initativename.tamusa.edu
 - c. Research labs might use labs.tamusa.edu/[labname]
- 2. Subdomains are not created for parts of the main TAMUSA website. All website addresses are tamusa.edu/college or unit name
- 3. Enterprise-level, university-wide software products, services and websites that serve both internal and external audiences outside of the main TAMUSA website may use [subdomain].tamusa.edu. For example,

products, services or website related to CRMs. (Ex. Jagwire.tamusa.edu)

4. Subdomains will be renewed yearly to determine visits and activity. If sites are not kept up to date, there is no activity or if there is no longer an "owner" for the site and its content, the site will be deleted.

Administrative office	No, should be a directory (also needs
	approval from MarCom/ITS)
	Example: tamusa.edu/academics/
Research lab	Yes, if approved by MarCom/ITS
	Example: labs.tamusa.edu/[labname]
School Program or College/Department	No should be a directory
Multiple-institution organization or	No, may use a .org
conference	Example: theinstitutesa.org
